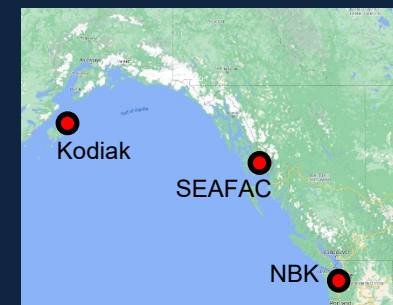

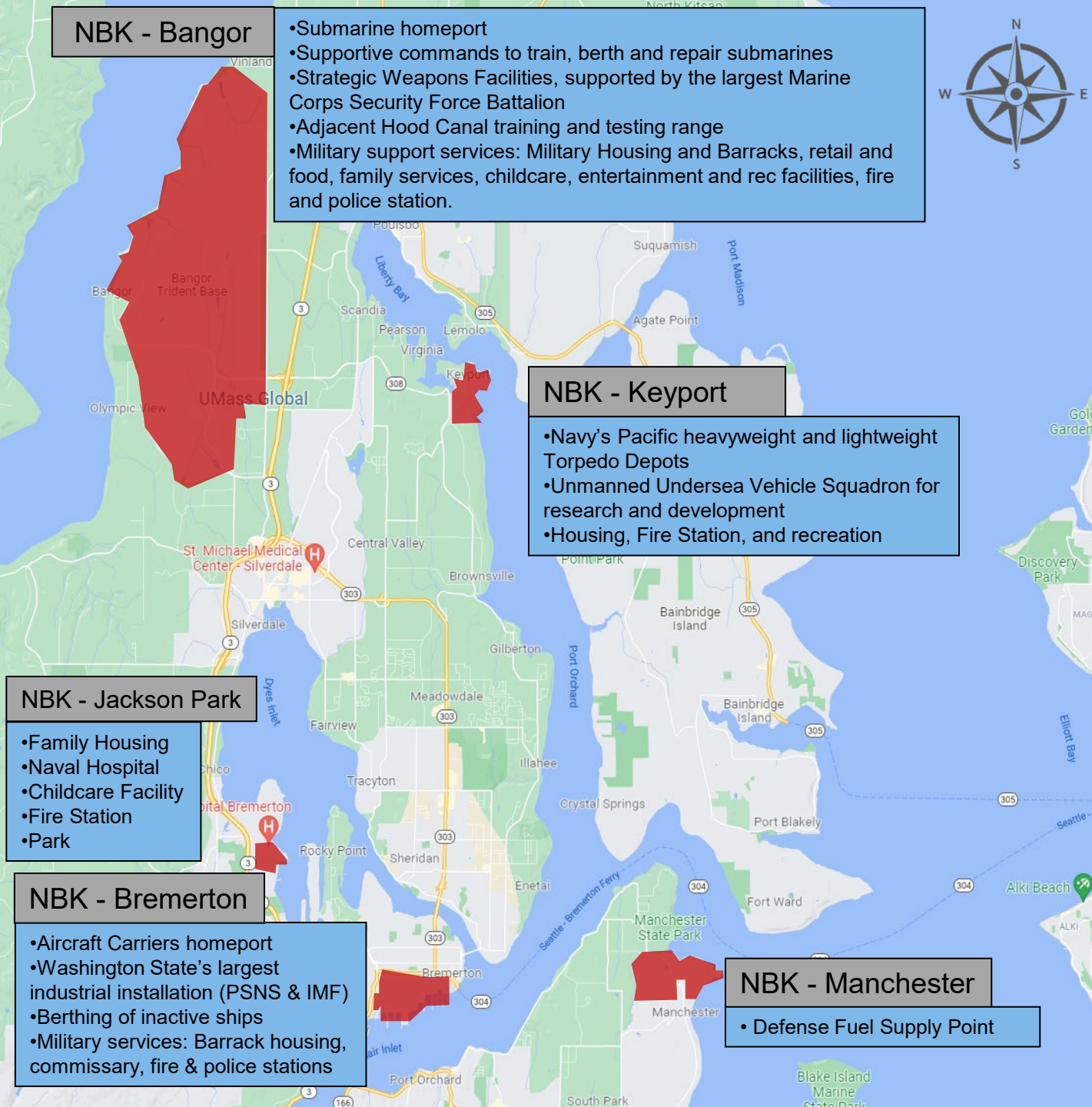

At NBK, we have:

- More than 1,700 family homes and 4,000 unaccompanied housing units – formerly known as barracks
- 6 fitness centers and 2 pools
- 3 hotels and 2 museums
- Several eateries including galleys, cafeterias and restaurants
- Recreational facilities such as 2 movie theaters, a bowling alley, softball and football fields, tracks and even a skateboard park

Waterfront Improvement Projects

Shipyard Infrastructure Optimization Program (SIOP)

- Upgrade shipyard dry dock capability, capacity, and seismic survivability to support Ford-class aircraft carriers
- Modify, remove, and/or replace other piers, wharves, quay walls, buildings, cranes, and utilities
- Draft EIS is in development, release date TBD

Columbia-Class Submarines (SSBN)

- Full fleet transition from OHIO-class submarines by 2042
- First COLUMBIA scheduled to arrive at NBK in mid 2030s

Drinking Water

- ***PFAS/PFOA Off-Base Sampling***
 - Sampling around Bangor took place in 2020 with an additional round with a new sample area in 2023.
 - Sampling near Manchester Fuel Depot took place in June 2023.
- ***Navy Installation Drinking Water Committees***
 - New Navy policy to increase drinking water system oversight, assessment, and coordination to further enhance the ability of Navy installations to operate and maintain water systems while continuing to meet drinking water quality standards.



Environmental Stewardship



- Committed to balancing Navy Mission with environmental stewardship responsibilities
- Our partnerships with federal, state, and local agencies; federally recognized tribes; and nongovernmental organizations enable us to sustain the Navy mission and promote Navy environmental stewardship programs (on land and at sea) in the Pacific Northwest

Collaborative efforts with the local communities and NBK that identifies actions that both the communities and installations can take to encourage compatible activities around the installations



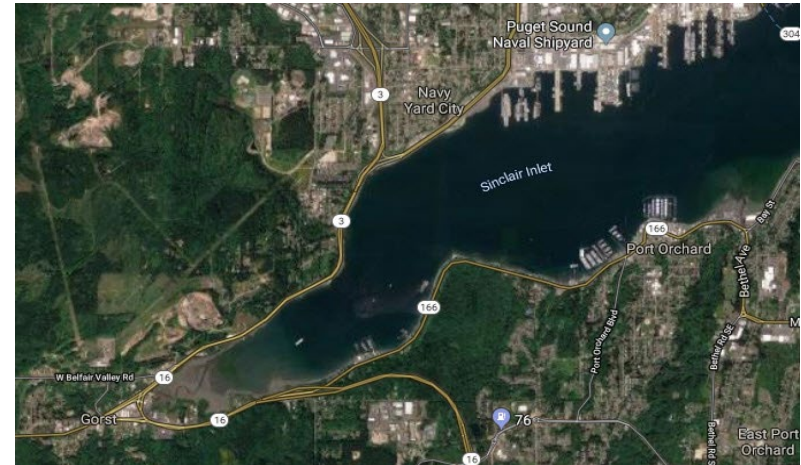
Joint Compatibility Transportation Plan (JCTP)

- City of Bremerton study, finalized in December 2023; funded by Dept. of Defense and Bremerton
- JCTP goal is to address transportation issues in Bremerton and ensure Bremerton's growth will not impede NBK–Bremerton missions which are critical to our Nation's military readiness (20-year plan)
- Ensure safe, and reliable commuting to- and from- the base
- Provide recommendations to improve transportation options to NBK and Bremerton (improve mass transit, safe park & rides, adaptive signaling, and much more)

Countywide Partnerships & Mutual Aid

- Awarded Kitsap County with \$10M grant in 2021 for sewer replacement near Keyport & Bangor (DCIP)
- Fire and emergency services in 2023
 - 1,550 Emergency Service Calls
 - Mutual-Aid: 327 / On-base: 1,223
- Community Service and Volunteerism in 2023
 - 277 personnel supported 44 events
 - 2,220+ hours committed
