HOUSING

HOME IMPROVEMENT – improving the lives of families through major and minor home repairs, HVAC/furnace repairs and replacements, and weatherization services.

- 102 Households received over \$1M worth of energy-saving or home improvement measures
- 111 Households received assistance with HVAC repairs or replacements

HOMEOWNERSHIP – making the dream of homeownership possible through mortgage loans, down payment assistance, homeowner education, and eligibility determination sessions.

- Mortgage Lending
 - 19 loans for a total of \$2,046,953
- Down Payment Assistance
 - 144 loans for a total of \$1,065,300
 - Leveraging \$20M in First Mortgage Loans
 - 132 were 1st time homeowners
- Homeowner Education
 - 115 individuals served
- Eligibility Determination Sessions
 - 255 loans closed with over \$51.4 M in mortgages

ACCOMPLISHMENTS



When Melody realized that she didn't qualify for a conventional mortgage even though she had little to no debt, she felt like she was out of options. That's when she contacted GROW South Dakota. When asked how her life has improved since receiving down payment funds, Melody said "owning a home will provide me with the space and security to work on my hobbies. I currently have to keep many of my projects and tools in a trailer as I didn't have space in the small one-bedroom apartment I was previously living in. I've had all my tools stolen in the past and look forward to having a secure place to keep them."

When Tasha brings in foster children, she knows the children need a safe place to call home, if only for a short time, Tasha decided to reach out to GROW SD, to see if any of these programs would be a good fit for her. Tasha explained, "I now have a more convenient place for when I get calls to take kiddos in."

Through Cheyenne's realtor and loan officer, she connected with GROW South Dakota who could assist her with a down payment. "They were amazing to work with and I learned so much from the housing class."



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Business Loans - supporting entrepreneurs through loans and technical assistance.

- Total amount loaned over \$8M
 - Average loan amount: \$95,000
 - Total number of loans 88
 - In 46 Cities, 28 Counties

Business Training- partnered with Co.Starters, Small Business Development Center, Google. Trainings that were provided: Quickbooks Basics, Quickbooks Inventory & Payroll, Funding for Start-up, Basics of Google Ads, Initiate, and What Lenders Look for in Financials.

324 clients – received 492 hours of training.

Small Business Development Center – provides business management consulting services to potential & existing businesses in SD.

- 174 clients were assisted
- \$14.2M in capital was obtained
- 89 jobs created/retained
- 8 businesses purchased and 4 new businesses created

The Meat and Poultry Intermediary Lending Program (MPILP)

- Provides funding for the start-up, expansion, or operation of processing of meat and poultry.
- Uses of funds purchase land, construction, equipment, and more!

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The BIG Idea Competition is a business idea competition for high school students. This year 277 entries were received from 54 different schools across the nation involving over 350 students.

COMMUNITY

Emergency Assistance - providing temporary assistance to individuals and families to stabilize their homes.

- Rental Assistance
 - 393 households assisted with a total of \$1,125,368
- Utility Assistance
 - 327 households assisted with a total of \$223,850
- Mortgage Assistance
 - 8 households assisted with a total of \$29,993
- Other Emergency Assistance
 - 48 households assisted with a total of \$35,966
 - Community Health Office Donations
 - 201 households assisted with \$ 20,574
- Food Pantry Donations
 - 458 households assisted with \$18,595

Community School Projects - GROW South Dakota has built and renovated four schools, in Oglala Lakota County to meet the critical educational needs of underserved populations in South Dakota. These projects used an innovative financial structure that utilized New Market Tax Credits (NMTC), a program designed to attract private investment in the community and economic development efforts in distressed communities.
